SCHOOL INFORMATION

"The purpose of Saint Paul Lutheran School is to provide a Christian education whereby students may find identity, purpose and power for their life in Christ by living in grace and in knowledge of Him as their Lord and Savior. In this Christian educational program, Saint Paul will educate the whole child by providing experiences for each child to grow spiritually, aesthetically, emotionally, intellectually, physically, and socially."

Saint Paul Lutheran School is supported and maintained by Saint Paul Lutheran Church, a member of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod. **In addition to formal religious instruction in every classroom, the Lutheran Christian faith and values are taught and modeled throughout all grade levels and curricular areas.** One of the most important strengths of Saint Paul lies in its well-educated, experienced, Christian teachers who provide a loving, family-friendly environment.

EARLY CHILDHOOD (Pre-Kindergarten through Grade 2) offers

- Dedicated, highly qualified teachers.
- An outstanding program in which children's learning styles are respected and nurtured.
- Age-appropriate developmental activities which gradually become more academic through the levels.
- A language-rich environment coupled with the basics of phonics, literature, mathematics, science, social studies, music, art, physical education, computers, and cooperative community building.
- Participation in regularly scheduled performance productions, in church and on the school stage.

MIDDLE ELEMENTARY (Grades 3-5) offers

- Excellent, highly-trained teachers, teaching children in a self-contained classroom setting.
- Increased student access to the school library/media center and computer lab to enhance academic study.
- Opportunities for participation in co-curricular and extra-curricular activities including Outdoor Education, band, strings, athletics, and clubs, as appropriate to the age.
- Enhanced opportunities for leadership in performance productions on stage and worship in church.

JUNIOR HIGH (Grades 6-8) offers

- Outstanding teachers, who are specialists in their fields, working with students in a departmentalized setting.
- An assigned homeroom teacher who monitors individual student progress through the course of the departmentalized curriculum.
- A progressive program which includes instruction in Spanish, Computer Education, Pre-Algebra and Algebra studies, Art in several media, Music including instrumental and vocal music and history study, in addition to the basic core of lab-based Science, English and Literature, World and U.S. History, Mathematics, and Physical Education.
- Increased opportunities for participation in co- and extra-curricular activities, including Academic Fair, Geography and Spelling Bees, Sports, and Cheerleading.
- Opportunities for leadership in school-wide programs: Chapel Assistants, Reading Buddies, tutoring younger children, and more.

IN ALL GRADE LEVELS, our Resource Teachers serve as consultants to classroom teachers, enabling them to better instruct students with special learning needs. Acting liaisons to area public schools, they assist parents who wish to access services through their district. Further, they plan enrichment activities for large and small groups.

SAINT PAUL EXTENDED CARE FOR KIDS provides a warm, caring environment for our students before and after school. This program is available to students in Pre-K (on days of school attendance) through Grade 8.

SAINT PAUL PARENT TEACHER LEAGUE (PTL) provides parents with opportunities for fellowship and schedules volunteers for many fundraising programs which support the school. Please ask the school office to learn how you can become involved!

SAINT PAUL PARISH SCHOOL MINISTRY is the governing body of the school and holds monthly meetings which are open to parents.

HEALTH INFORMATION: PHYSICALS & EMERGENCY FORMS

The State of Illinois requires **PHYSICALS** upon entering Pre-Kindergarten, Kindergarten and Sixth grade.

Saint Paul requires annual PHYSICALS for all students new to the school and for those participating in extra-curricular athletics. In addition, ALL students must have a school-supplied Emergency Form on file in the office.

The State of Illinois requires **DENTAL Examinations** for children in kindergarten, second, and sixth grades.

The State of Illinois requires **VISION Examinations** for children in kindergarten and those new to the school.

STUDENTS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO ATTEND CLASSES OR PARTICIPATE IN PRACTICES OR GAMES UNTIL PHYSICALS AND EMERGENCY FORMS ARE ON FILE IN THE SCHOOL OFFICE.

If the immunization record, listed on the physical form, is found not to be in compliance with state guidelines, students will be given two weeks in which to comply with the regulations before being excluded from school. Information about these guidelines and Cook County Department of Public Health assistance are available in the school office.

LEAD POISONING PREVENTION ACT

This legislation requires that parents of children between the ages of six months through six years provide a statement from a physician or health care provider that the child has been screened for lead poisoning. This statement is to be provided prior to admission and subsequently in conjunction with physical examinations. The Illinois Department of Public Health has revised the Certificate of Child Health Examination (school physical form) listing lead screening as a physical examination requirement. However, neither the School Code nor the Lead Poisoning Prevention Act authorize the exclusion of children who have not been screened from educational programs in which the child is otherwise eligible to participate.

ADMISSION POLICY

Saint Paul Lutheran School admits students of any race, color, national and ethnic origin to all the rights, privileges, programs, and activities generally accorded or made available to students at the school. It does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national and ethnic origin in administration of its educational policies, admissions policies, scholarship and loan programs, and athletic or other school-administered programs.

Saint Paul Lutheran School gives preference in applying for admission to members of Saint Paul Lutheran Church. Returning students (students enrolled in classes during the current school year) are given preference in applying for admission. **Students must be three years of age by November 1 of the current school year in order to enter Pre-Kindergarten classes, five years of age by September 1 in order to enter Kindergarten, and six years of age by September 1 in order to enter first grade.**

All students enrolling at Saint Paul Lutheran School for the first time (or re-enrolling after a lapse in attendance) are required to submit a birth certificate. Parents of transfer students will be required to fill out a "Request for a Transfer of Records" form which will enable Saint Paul to receive an official transcript from the student's previous school. Saint Paul will request special education and disciplinary records in addition to the usual health, academic and attendance records.

Please be aware that staff or representatives of Saint Paul Lutheran Church and School may take photos or videos of students enrolled in Saint Paul Lutheran School. These photos and videos are for Saint Paul use only, and may be used for publication, broadcast, website or social media use, as deemed appropriate by Saint Paul Lutheran Church & School. No child will be identified in these publications.

Children with special needs which cannot be addressed by programs offered at Saint Paul or Release Time programs may be denied enrollment or enrollment may be discontinued in order to encourage them to enroll at a school that can provide an appropriate program.

Application for Enrollment Process:

- ❖ Complete an enrollment form for each student. Forms may be completed online and emailed to the school office but will not be processed until the \$60 enrollment fee is received.
- ❖ Preschool and Kindergarten families also need to complete the appropriate Initial Information sheet for each student.
- ❖ Schedule an interview with the principal *(required for new students in 1st – 8th grades only)*.
- ❖ If desired, visit a classroom or tour the school *(by appointment, please)*.
- ❖ Enroll at the proper time *(see schedule below)*.
- ❖ Bring completed enrollment form, non-refundable deposit, and original copy of birth certificate *(birth certificates needed for new students only)* to the school office.

Enrollment Schedule:

1. Member families applying for enrollment and returning families applying for enrollment in grades pre-kindergarten through eight may enroll **beginning Monday, January 13, 2020 at 8:00am**. All families are encouraged to enroll **no later than Monday, March 2, 2020**.

The first period for accepting Application for Enrollment is reserved for member families and returning students applying for admission to grades preschool through eight. (Returning families are those students who are enrolled in classes during the **current** school year.) The date and time are noted on each application form as it is received in the office. Member families and returning families applying for admission to grades preschool through eight who do not apply during this period may apply at any other time, but will be given no preference over other families if classes are filled.

2. Open Enrollment begins **Tuesday, February 4, 2020 at 8:00am**

Applications for Enrollment are accepted until classes are full. A Waiting List is maintained for filled classes. The date and time are noted on each application form as it is received in the office.

Waiting List:

The Principal reviews Applications for Enrollment with the Parish School Ministry after March 2, 2020 in order to notify those families whose Application for Enrollment has been accepted and those who have been placed on a Waiting List by March 16, 2020. When an opening occurs, students are moved from the Waiting List to enrollment status based on the date and time noted on the Application for Enrollment.

S.P.E.C.K. may be available on scheduled in-service/conference days if a substantial need is shown and adequate personnel is available to staff the facility.

Fees: There will be a flat rate of \$8 charged for any time used between 3-4pm (prek) and 3:15-4pm (K-8). Families are billed monthly.

 - Immunization & medical exams are required for all new students, all students entering kindergarten, and all students entering sixth grade.
 - Dental exams are required for students entering kindergarten, second and sixth grades.
 - Vision exams by a licensed optometrist are required for all students entering kindergarten and all new students in grades 1-8.
- ❖ We will mail a summer packet including school supply list, before **July 15**.
- ❖ Pre-kindergarten teachers will contact parents regarding home visits in **August**.
- ❖ Physical Exam forms for pre-kindergarten and kindergarten are due on **August 12**.
- ❖ We will see you at registration for kindergarten through eighth grade on **August 14**.
- ❖ Kindergarten parent orientation is on **August 17**.

Children who have not been picked up by 3:30 p.m. and whose names are not on the Walker's List will be escorted to Saint Paul Extended Care for Kids (SPECK). Normal SPECK charges will apply.

INITIAL HERE

Saint Paul Lutheran Church maintains its Christian Day School to help parents bring up their children in the nurture and admonition of the Lord. To this end, the chief doctrines of the Bible are taught and the children receive training in Christian living and citizenship. It is necessary for home, church, and school to work together toward common goals in the training of our children. Christian love, faith, obedience, and respect, which are practiced in the home, must be extended and reinforced in the school. Families are encouraged to make regular use of Bible reading, prayer, family devotions, and church attendance.
